The Bible tells us about a Christian, named Epaphroditus, who took great risks to help others. Today believers around the world risk their lives for the cause of Jesus Christ. They remind me of Desmond Doss whose story is told in the movie *Hacksaw Ridge*. Doss, a Seventh Day Adventist from the hills of Virginia, enlisted in the Army with the understanding he could serve as a medic and therefore not violate his firm belief in "thou shalt not kill." When he arrived at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, he was in for a rude surprise. His sergeant, his captain, and the judge at the subsequent military hearing didn't care much for Doss's convictions. Nor did members of his platoon, who accused him of cowardice and let him know how they felt with their fists. Doss stood firm despite facing years of imprisonment. He told a military tribunal, "With the world so set on tearing itself apart, it don't seem like such a bad thing to me to put a little bit of it back together." The Army gave in and Doss went with his platoon to Okinawa and scaled a cliff known as "the escarpment" (Hacksaw Ridge). Hundreds of GI's perished in the fight that day. At night, as the wounded lay in agony, Doss went from man to man, dragged them to the edge of the cliff and lowered them on a rope one by one. In all he saved 75 wounded GIs from certain death. For his actions, President Truman awarded Doss the Congressional Medal of Honor. He is the only conscientious objector in U.S. history to win the nation's highest award. Doss quietly and courageously sought to be a good citizen but knew where his true citizenship lay (Philippians 3:20). Abuse, scorn, the threat of imprisonment, even Japanese bullets could not induce him to abandon his convictions. Doss backed his convictions with his actions. His humility, bravery and willingness to sacrifice his life for his brother soldiers, including those who had mocked him, won over even his harshest critics. In a time when so many seem to have no moral compass and have forsaken Jesus Christ, may we be like Desmond Doss. In Christ,

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. 1 John 1:7

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

I love to walk places. This might come as a bit of a shock to some of you. Especially those that know I grew up in California and that is a state that seems to be built as one collective freeway it seems! Walking is not really an option in most instances there!

I have been blessed though to live in two other places. Holland, Michigan for college and seminary and now in Richboro. I am grateful that each of these places, with a bit of creativity in route, have been walkable for many day in and day out tasks.

I could go on and on for a while sharing many of the things I love about being able to walk places. I have no doubt you might have a host of reasons to share with me about how driving is far superior to walking! Putting those things aside though for just a moment I want to reflect on walking through the lens of being in relationship to Jesus. Overwhelmingly in scripture our relationship to God is shared in comparison to walking with Him. Above is one such instruction from 1 John telling us as such. Walking in the light of Christ brings us into His presence and fellowship with His people.

Yet walking is a unique way to share this relationship. Couldn't living or sharing or drawing close better illustrate this reality and need for us? While walking in the light of Christ certainly leads us to live in His light, I want to pay closer attention to this call to walk in the light of Christ. One reason is in that when we walk with Him we consider two things right out of the gate. First it is an action. It is taking a step with Jesus. To say we live or draw close to Him is certainly a part of this, walking in the Light of Christ always means taking steps toward Him. And second, walking is a slow pace. Notice again the invitation throughout scripture and here in 1 John is to walk in the Light of Christ, not run or sprint or jog, no it is walk. Walking allows for conversation and space to see what is going on. To change course more quickly and to stop and rest if need be.

At its best, the times I am able to walk places afford me this opportunity to step with Jesus and consider all the places His light is at work in my life and in lives of those I am able to walk alongside of in fellowship.

I pray that as you walk with Jesus in the month ahead you have space and time to see His light shining in and through you each step of the way!



**FOR MAY**, the Mission of the Month is ChoiceOne Crisis Pregnancy Center in Levittown. They are a not-for-profit organization for women created and run by women. At ChoiceOne, they uniquely specialize in the care of women's emotional, spiritual, relational, physical, sexual, reproductive, and mental health. All their programs are designed by women for women.

At ChoiceOne, they offer services that are designed to minister to a woman's heart, mind, body, and soul at any age or in any circumstance. They understand the pressures of being a single or unsupported mother; they understand the heartache and fear held within economic instability, resource insecurity, infidelity, single parenthood, and relationship violence. ChoiceOne is spiritually inspired and created to help women understand that they are unconditionally loved by God, and they, in turn, strive to love and serve with integrity.

ChoiceOne offers two types of counseling services: Mentorship and Professional Counseling, including counseling for depression, anxiety, family relationships and other issues.

Regarding pregnancy, ChoiceOne offers pregnancy screening, material assistance (diapers, formula, baby clothes and equipment), mom to mom mentoring, parenting classes and other means to support moms and their babies.

Addisville will be running a fundraising campaign for ChoiceOne starting in May. Baby bottles will be available for you to return filled with change and donations will be gratefully accepted – just note that the donation is for ChoiceOne.

## FINANCE COMMITTEE



Guess what?! Financially, Addisville, had another good month in March. Receipts in March 2024 in the Current Fund were \$52,220 compared with \$30,373 in 2024. This is an increase of \$21,847 year over year.

Although this is exciting, I must inform you that there were five Sundays in March this year and one of them was Easter. Both these events will inflate the total for the month. I estimate that about \$10,000 of the increase can be attributed to Easter and the extra Sunday.

So, if I am right, March this year compared to last year increased by about \$11,000. Pat yourself on your back, but give thanks to the Lord! Your faithfulness to Jesus and His church at Addisville is producing tremendous results.

For the year to March 31, 2024, we are indicating a positive net balance in the Current Fund of \$6,453 compared to a deficit of \$33,658 last year for the same period (don't forget the Easter and five Sundays in March impact).

Also, for the first time this year, we are projecting a modest surplus of \$1,646 by the end of this year.

I hope I did not load you up with too many numbers, but the news is exciting. We could expect nothing less from this wonderful family of Addisville, which is dedicated to its mission to share the Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ. We owe all our gratitude to Him!
